SANC highlighted at the 2013 National Plant Board Meeting

The SANC Initiative was on prominent display at the National Plant Board annual meeting in Louisville Kentucky, August 4-8, 2013.

- During the NPB business meeting, Wayne Dixon presented drafts of the revised NPB <u>Model Plant Pest</u> <u>Law</u> and <u>Model Nursery Law</u> that incorporate language consistent with a systems approach to nursery certification.
- <u>A poster display</u> was available throughout the meeting, providing a description of current SANC documents and their purpose in the context of building a systems approach to nursery certification.
- A panel discussion featured perspective from Industry, NPB, and USDA partners on the value and impact
 of systems approaches. The panel also gave an early picture of a SANC pilot project. Questions and
 comments from audience members provided excellent input for the SANC core group to use as it
 continues developing tools to facilitate the use of a systems approach in nursery certification programs.
